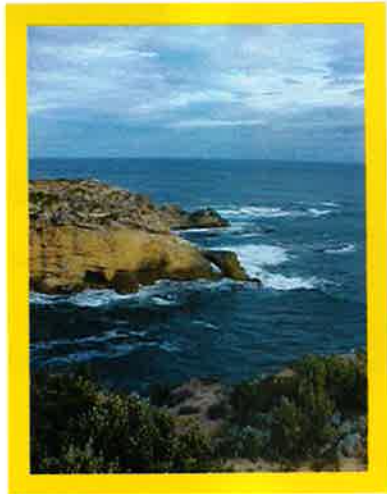


Coastal Carvings

Southern Ocean Sunsets

Cape Northumberland is the most southerly point of South Australia. It is also one of the most spectacular locations to have an uninterrupted view of sunrise and sunset.

The Southern Ocean's unquestioned mood at this most southerly point creates a unique performance of natural beauty, as it washes against the main land rock face while you view the sunrise or set for the day.

Little Penguins

Every evening around dusk the Little Fairy Penguins march one by one to their well protected home at Cape Northumberland.

The purpose built Penguin Viewing Platform provides the best views of the little penguins at dusk or dawn and maintains their natural habitat without any interference or disruption to the surrounding environment.
