# **Council Update**

At the District Council of Grant's monthly meeting on Monday 19 June 2023, the 2023/2024 Annual Business Plan and Budget was endorsed by the Elected Members for an \$18.6M operating expenditure.

Council has decided to fund a deficit budget of \$154,000 while ensuring service levels and capital works programs are maintained in this current high cost environment. The plan introduces a general rate increase of 7.6% which is 0.3% lower than CPI and is in alignment with Council's Long Term Financial Plan and Asset Management Plans.

The 2023/2024 Budget will invest in the community by carrying out key projects looking at a long term Playground Strategy, Local Heritage survey and a comprehensive review of Council's current Strategic Management Plan.

Council has also committed to deliver major capital works in the upcoming financial year which includes \$3.759M towards the Transport and Infrastructure Program, \$444,000 for upgrades to community and Council owned buildings, and \$46,000 for Community Waste Management Systems (CWMS).

Another \$305,000 will be allocated to IT software and equipment upgrades and modernisation across all Council sites including its Principal Office, Port MacDonnell Community Complex, Mount Gambier and District Saleyards, and Mount Gambier Regional Airport.

Throughout the year, Council will continue to be proactive in seeking grant funding to assist with funding and advocacies new projects to benefit the community.

# **Council Decisions**

- Community Land Management Plans (CLMPs) Endorsed: At the Ordinary Council Meeting held on Monday 19 June 2023, thirty four revised CLMPs were adopted after community consultation.
- Disposal of Community Land: At the Ordinary Council Meeting held on Monday 19 June 2023, Council received and noted Timberlink Australia Pty Ltd's Expressions of Interest to purchase an adjoining parcel of land. Council authorised the CEO or delegate to work alongside Timberlink to undertake community engagement relating to ths matter.

# Waste and Recycling Update

#### Waste Transfer Stations

Each property in the District Council of Grant is eligible for a cashless waste transfer station voucher at the commencement of each financial year. The voucher card entitles the resident / tenant to 6 visits, with a heaped tandem trailer load of segregated waste considered to be the maximum quantity for each visit on the voucher card.

Segregated loads of scrap metal are free, and green waste during the fire danger season will not constitute a visit on the voucher.

Vouchers are now available to collect at the District Council of Grant Principal Office (324 Commercial Street West, Mount Gambier) and Port MacDonnell Community Complex (5 Charles Street, Port MacDonnell) by phone, email or in person.

#### **Mobile Garbage Bins**


Pictured on the bottom right of this page is Council's updated Mobile Garbage Bin calendar for


2023/2024. Please note it is imperative that bins are placed out the night before or prior to 6:00am on the day of your service to ensure collection.

The bin is to be placed with the lid opening towards the road and the lid is kept closed to prevent animal scavenging and/or wind blowing rubbish along the roadside.

Bins which are overweight (above 70kg) or contaminated may not be collected. A sticker will be placed on your bin to advise of reason for non-collection.

# **BOAT RAMP PERMITS**

### **Blackfellows Caves &** Port MacDonnell

From 1 July 2023, a new online boat ramp ticketing system called EasyPark will be in operation for all permit types which means hard copy permits are now redundant.

Both physical boat ramp ticketing machines at Blackfellows Caves and Port MacDonnell have been removed and new signage is currently being manufactured with the design created in collaboration with the Allendale East Area School to provide additional environmental messaging from students.

Boat ramp users must acquire a Boat Ramp Permit linked to the boat trailer registration on site.

#### Failure to acquire a permit when using the facility will result in enforcement action.





#### **DAILY, WEEKLY & MONTHLY PERMITS**

Short term Boat Ramp Permits are to be purchased directly via EasyPark as per the graphic below.

#### **ANNUAL PERMITS**

Annual Boat Ramp Permits for both recreational and professional/commercial users are to be purchased through the District Council of Grant Customer Service Centres.

An Application for Annual Boat Ramp Permit Form must be completed and returned to Council in alignment with payment.



Rates continue to be a major source of Council's income so that the required redevelopments and services can be funded.

### **Rating Information**

#### **Differential Rates**

Council uses capital value as assessed by the State Valuation Office as the basis of valuing land, which is considered the fairest method for distributing the rate burden across all ratepayers.

#### **Payment of Rates**

Rates are due and payable in four instalments: 1 September 2023, 1 December 2023, 1 March 2024, and 7 June 2024. If an instalment of rates is not paid on or before the last day of payment, fines and interest are payable on the arrears.



#### **Regional Landscape Levy (RLL)**

Legislation requires Council to collect the RLL. Please direct all enquiries to the Limestone Coast Landscape Board on (08) 8735 1204.

## Community Wastewater Management Schemes



Council charges for the removal, treatment and appropriate disposal of domestic waste water in a number of towns across the District.

#### Mobile Garbage Bin Collection

A 2 bin kerbside rubbish and recycling collection service is provided by Council in defined collection areas.

#### Waste Transfer Vouchers (WTV)

Each property in the District is eligible for one cashless WTV at the start of each financial year. The voucher entitles six visits to a Waste Transfer Station. Obtain a WTV by contacting Council via phone, email or in person. Further details about the system are listed on Council's website.

Each year Council reviews its services and projects to understand our community's needs and expectations for the upcoming financial year, and also how we deliver works and services in the most cost effective way.

Actions outlined in Council's Strategic Management Plan 2020-2030 are incorporated into a Draft Annual Business Plan and Budget, which are then considered at a Council Meeting.

Next, the Draft Plan goes out to our community for public consultation. Any additional challenges, risks and opportunities highlighted through the consultation period are considered and incorporated into the Revised Draft Plan where possible, which is then presented to Council.

Council then endorses the Plan at a Council Meeting ready for implementation in July 2023.
