ENGAGEMENT UPDATE

Nine locations throughout the district are set to receive playground equipment upgrades this financial year following the receival of Federal Government stimulus funding from Phase 3 of the Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program.

Stage 1 - Community consultation concluded on Thursday, 29 September 2022 for the Carpenter Rocks playground upgrade. Feedback is being reviewed by staff and a refined playground design is to be confirmed in the coming weeks, which will be uploaded to Your Say DCG.

Thank you to all who participated in the Carpenter Rocks Playground Upgrade Project, your feedback is greatly appreciated.

Stage 2 - Phase one of community engagement has commenced for the Port MacDonnell playground, adjacent to The Waterfront. Two community meetings were held on the mornings of Tuesday, 20 and 27 September 2022 at the Port MacDonnell Community Complex to compile ideas from the community about desired equipment envisaged for ages 6 and under.

Staff are currently reviewing the feedback received and developing playground options for the community to consider.

Phase two, of opening community consultation to present suitable playground options, is on track to commence within the coming week.

An evening community meeting is scheduled to occur at the **Port MacDonnell Community Complex Thursday**, **27 October 2022** commencing at 6:00pm. Interested community members are invited to attend to discuss the playground designs as part of phase two.

Voting packs will be distributed between Friday, 14 October and Thursday, 20 October. Each pack will include information about the candidates standing for election along with a postal voting guide. Telephone voting will be available between Monday, 17 October and Thursday, 10 November 2022.

Voting will close at 5pm Thursday, 10 November 2022.

Unlike State and Federal elections, it is not compulsory to vote in Council elections. However, Council encourages all community members eligible to have their say as it is now more important then ever to vote on the Plebiscite concerning the proposed examination of an amalgamation between District Council of Grant and City of Mount Gambier.

The Plebiscite (South East Council Amalgamation) Bill 2022 passed South Australia's Upper House on Tuesday, 27 September 2022. The District Council of Grant's appeal for a majority vote in each Council community to allow for equal representation was not amended in the parliament.

Eligible residents, property and business owners, and renters across the District Council of Grant are encouraged to take action and cast their vote in the 2022 Council Elections. Every four years whole state elections are held in South Australia

All voting in the is done by post where ballot papers will be delivered through the mail to each elector with a reply paid envelope provided. However, this year the Electoral Commission of South Australia (ECSA) are providing telephone assisted voting for blind or low vision electors along with electors interstate or overseas

To ensure that residents are informed on the process of the Plebiscite being a simple majority vote and the approach following the vote, the Local Government Association (LGA) will be facilitating community information sessions.

Two in-person sessions are scheduled to occur on Wednesday, 19 October 2022 as follows:

- Port MacDonnell Community Complex at 5:30pm
- City Hall Riddoch Arts & Cultural Centre, Watson Terrace (entry via Cave Gardens) at 7:00pm

The LGA announced bookings are essential for both sessions.

PORT MACDONNELL & Blackfellows caves Boat Ramp Ticket Machines

Please be advised that the current boat ramp ticket machines will be removed due to the machines no longer being in a good working condition.

As per Council resolution, endorsed at the Ordinary Council Meeting held on Monday, 16 May 2022, the machines will be replaced with new signage promoting the ongoing use of the Easy Park system.

Boat Ramp Permits are still required to be purchased via the Easy Park system while this change occurs. Assistance is available at the Port MacDonnell Community Complex (5/7 Charles Street, Port MacDonnell) and via Easy Park on 1300 734 070.

New signage is currently being designed by Council in collaboration with the Allendale East Area School to provide additional environmental messaging from students. Signage installation is anticipated to occur at the end of November 2022.



For the littler ones, they can enjoy the sounds of classic nursery rhymes while they do tummy time or enjoy a kick around on their blanket.



What is the Community Grants Scheme?

The scheme is for community groups to develop projects and events that enhance community wellbeing and increase participation in social and leisure activities.

Who is eligible to apply?

Incorporated not-for-profit organisations based in or servicing the District Council of Grant that:

- Do not collect substantial income from other sources; and
- Provide a valuable service or benefit to the District Council of Grant community.

What is required to apply?

- A project or event that responds to a community need or helps build a stronger community in the District Council of Grant.
- Public Liability Insurance or the capacity to take out appropriate coverage.
- Quotes to support your application.

- 75% Council (maximum \$1,000)
- 25% applicant
