- Saleyards Fencing, partial replacement of laneway fencing

New key projects have been identified to be completed this financial year. Some include:

- Playground Upgrades
- Port MacDonnell Memorial Wall
- Strategic Landuse Project
- Disability Access and Inclusion Projects

Various roads will also be upgraded as part of Council's road upgrade program.

#### **Access and Inclusion Advisory Panel**

### NOMINATING

Nominations for the 2022 Council Elections closed at 12 noon Tuesday, 6 September with the ballot draw being conducted shortly after 4pm that day. Pictured on the right is Council's Governance Officer and local Deputy Returning Officer during the ballot draw.

### VOTING

All voting in the Council elections is done by post. Enrolled voters will receive a voting package through the mail and return their completed ballot paper in a reply paid envelope provided.

Voting packs will be distributed between Friday, 14 October and Thursday, 20 October. Each pack will include information about the candidates standing for election along with a postal voting guide. **Voting will close at 5pm Friday, 10 November 2022.** 

Unlike State and Federal elections, it is not compulsory to vote in Council elections. However Council elections are the biggest single voluntary civic participation activity in the state.

The District Council of Grant have identified that some existing playground infrastructure within the area requires attention and Council are being proactive to repair, maintain and/or replace this equipment.

Playground upgrades have been included in Council's major project works program for the 2022/2023 financial year, following the receival of Federal Government stimulus funding. The stimulus funding is being provided by the Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program.

The following locations are included in the project works package and will have works carried out to gradually renew the existing playgrounds to ensure conformance with the Australian Standards:

- Blackfellows Caves
- Nene Valley
- Carpenter Rocks
- Port MacDonnell
- DonovansKongorong
- TarpeenaYahl
- Mount Schank



Due to significant works involved, Council will be seeking feedback from the community to determine what equipment will be best suited for those items that require replacement. Council staff have carefully researched and considered equipment options for the playground based on availability, suitability, budget and ongoing maintenance. A staged community engagement approach will be taken to present options to each township.

<u>Stage 1</u> is the Carpenter Rocks playground upgrade. Residents and visitors of the area are encouraged to review the playground options proposed and complete a survey to vote for your most preferred equipment between **Friday**, **9 September and Thursday**, **29 September 2022**. Additional feedback is welcome for future improvements to the playground, however this feedback will be considered by Council in future budgets.

<u>Stage 2</u> will involve upgrades to the Port MacDonnell playground adjacent to The Waterfront. Council are yet to formalise equipment options for the playground and are inviting community members who are interested in this project to join us at the Port MacDonnell Community Complex (PMCC) to provide their thoughts on preferred pieces.

Staff will be at the PMCC on **Tuesday**, **20 & 27 September 2022** at 10:20am. Please note this will be in conjunction with the weekly Story Time.

### PORT MACDONNELL & BLACKFELLOWS CAVES BOAT RAMP TICKET MACHINES

#### Attention Boat Ramp Users:

Please be advised that the current boat ramp ticket machines will be removed due to the machines no longer being in a good working condition. As per Council resolution, endorsed at the Ordinary Council Meeting held on Monday, 16 May 2022, the machines will be replaced with new signage promoting the ongoing use of the Easy Park system.

Boat Ramp Permits are still required to be purchased via the Easy Park system while this change occurs. Assistance is available at the Port MacDonnell Community Complex (5/7 Charles Street, Port MacDonnell) and through Easy Park on 1300 734 070.

New signage is currently being designed by Council in collaboration with the Allendale East Area School to provide additional environmental messaging from students. Signage installation is anticipated to occur at the end of November 2022.

## **1 MILLION TURTLES COMMUNITY CONSERVATION PROGRAM**

This program promotes a strong collaboration between scientists and the community to support initiatives aimed at conserving threatened Australian freshwater turtle species. The 1 Million Turtles Community Conservation Program creates opportunities for the community to actively learn, participate and contribute to freshwater turtle research and conservation.

**Is this something you want to get involved with?** Visit the 1 Million Turtles website (linked below) to register for workshops and livestreams, and record your turtle sightings via TurtleSAT mobile app.



Logging your sightings improves knowledge of species distribution and highlights locations of concern for high road kill and nest predation.

You can also do your part by moving turtles found on the road. The 1 Million Turtles website has some handy tips on how to safely remove turtles from the roadside.

## **AMALGAMATION PLEBISCITE**

Council called a Special Meeting on Friday, 23 September 2022 to discuss the Plebiscite (South East Council Amalgamation) Bill 2022.

Council resolved:

**1.** Receive and note Council report Plebiscite (South East Council Amalgamation) Bill 2022 as presented on 23 September 2022.

**2.** The CEO write to members of the government and express our extreme concern about the Plebiscite (South East Council Amalgamation) Bill 2022.

Our questions:

- 1. What constitutes a successful plebiscite
- 2. Transparency in the results and how it will go on public record
- 3. And the right to continue to consult through all steps of this process

In the absence of answers to these questions our community is denied a representative vote and if support of a majority vote the outcome could constitute a forced amalgamation. Our rate payers need to be well informed and their decisions are respected.

We recommend the plebiscite is stopped and failing that, the plebiscite outcome to investigate amalgamation between District Council of Grant and City of Mount Gambier require a majority vote in each Council community.
