

## COUNCIL ENGAGEMENT

Council invites you to provide your feedback on two (2) community consultation projects; the proposed Community Land lease renewals for the Port MacDonnell, Blackfellows Caves and Donovans Country Fire Service (CFS) Depots and draft Dog and Cat Management Plan (the Plan) 2022-2027.

The Plan is based on the legislative requirements as prescribed by the Dog and Cat Management Act 1995 with the intention to meet local priorities, and respond to feedback and input from the community, industry stakeholders, Elected Members, and Council staff.

The proposed CFS depot lease and licence renewals are due to expire within the next twelve (12) months and are currently instated for a period of twenty one (21) years with the option to extend for a further twenty one (21) years.

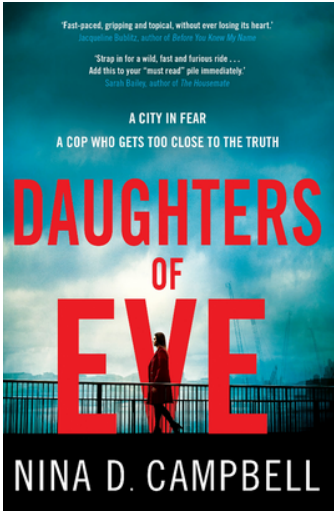

If you do not appear on the roll and are an Australian citizen aged 18 or over, you should enrol immediately via the Australian Electoral Commission website at: <https://www.ecsa.sa.gov.au/enrolment>.

#### WHO CAN APPLY?

Incorporated not-for-profit organisations based in or servicing the DCG that:

- Do not collect substantial income from other sources and
- Provide a valuable service or benefit to the DCG community

#### WHAT DO YOU NEED TO APPLY?

- A project or event that responds to a community need or helps build a stronger community in the DCG
- Public Liability Insurance or the capacity to take out appropriate coverage
- Quotes to support your application

#### COMMUNITY HALLS

- Maximum Council allocation \$1000
- Council 75% (up to \$1,000) and applicant 25% contribution

#### COMMUNITY GROUPS

- Maximum Council allocation \$2,500
- Council 75% (up to \$2,500K) and applicant 25% contribution

#### SPORTING CLUBS

- Maximum Council allocation \$800
- Council 50% (up to \$800) and applicant 50% contribution
