Grants Update

At the Ordinary Meeting on Monday 18 September 2023. Council endorsed an increase to the Community Grants Scheme funding pool to \$80,000 (+\$16,000) and additional amendments based on feedback from community organisations.

Council is pleased to now announce the re-launch of the program.

The new Community Grants Scheme features three grant categories:

- Sporting Clubs (up to \$1,000)
- Community Groups (up to \$3,000 or \$5,000)
- Community Participation (up to \$500)

The programs objectives remain the same; to develop projects and events that enhance community wellbeing and increase participation in social and leisure activities.

Applicants should note:

- Only one successful application is entitled under the scheme per financial year;
- Funding is provided over two application rounds per financial year, depending on budget availability; and
- No multi-year funding is available.

Applications open Monday 30 October 2023 and close 5:00pm Monday 11 December 2023.

Australia Day Citizen of the Year Awards



Nominations now open

The District Council of Grant are calling for the community to help recognise the unsung heroes within our district by nominating them for a 2024 Citizen of the Year Award.

The Citizen of the Year Awards are designed to acknowledge and celebrate the contributions of those who dedicate their time to making our district a better place. Both individuals and organisations are eligible for the Awards with outstanding dedication in community service areas such as education, health, fundraising, charitable and voluntary services, business, sport, arts, the environment, or any other area that contributes to the advancement and wellbeing of our community.

Mayor Kylie Boston said "It is important that individuals and groups are celebrated for their valued commitment as our community would not be as strong and vibrant as it is without their efforts."

Nominations are open for the following categories:

- Young Citizen of the Year (persons between 16 and 30 years of age on 26 January 2024);

- Community Event of the Year (events staged during 2023); and
- Active Citizenship (delivery of outstanding work or for an event or cause staged during 2023).

Fire Danger Season

Get your property bushfire ready



The Country Fire Service (CFS) Chief Officer is yet to declare the official 2023/2024 Fire Danger Season dates for the Lower South East. An announcement is anticipated mid November 2023.

Residents within the District Council of Grant are encouraged to begin preparing their properties for the upcoming Fire Danger Season. Below are some tips to assist in preparations:

What to do in SPRING

- Slash or mow long grass and remove cut materials;
- Remove weeds around sheds and fences;
- Cut back trees overhanging to roofs;
- Remove fallen branches and other debris;
- Check and service all mechanical equipment, including grass cutters, water pumps, sprinkler systems and fire extinguishers;
- Remove leaves from gutters; and
- Review and update your Bushfire Survival Plan.

What to do in SUMMER

- Maintain a 20-metre fuel reduction zone around your home (greater if on a slope);
- Remove leaves from the gutters;
- Slash stubble near sheds and other buildings;
- Check reserve water supplies;
- Rehearse your Bushfire Survival Plan with your family;
- Prepare evacuation kit;
- Ensure you have a portable battery-powered radio to hear bushfire warnings; and
- Monitor fire restrictions.

Positive Ageing Luncheons

Council and local students join forces to say: don't be the reason our ocean creatures disappear!

The District Council of Grant and Allendale East Area School have partnered to create three sign installations asking visitors near the ocean to dispose of waste in designated rubbish bins to help protect local sea life.

The new signage has been installed at both Port MacDonnell and Blackfellows Caves boat ramps replacing the physical boat ramp ticketing machines at both locations. All signs incorporate artworks from students of all ages at the Allendale East Area School which convey environmental messaging and provides additional information regarding general boat ramp usage.

Mayor Kylie Boston said "It is wonderful to see ideas created from classroom learnings be transformed into the real-world environment,. Council is pleased to have been able to work together with the staff and students at Allendale East Area School, and support their messaging concept."

Another key component of the new signage is the ongoing use of Council's digital boat ramp permit system, EasyPark, in operation as at 1 July 2023.

Short-term boat ramp users can continue to purchase a daily, weekly or monthly permit via the EasyPark app downloadable on any smart phone or over the phone with the EasyPark customer service team on 1300 734 070.

Annual recreational and professional/commercial users will be required to contact a District Council of Grant Customer Service Office to purchase and be added into the online system.

Mount Gambier Regional Airport

Cross border Airport collaboration



The District Council of Grant and Glenelg Shire Council have joined forces to ensure consistent service levels are met for regional air travellers.

Staff at the Council owned and operated airports Mount Gambier Regional Airport and Portland Airport identified an opportunity to reduce the risk of staffing shortfalls, which has resulted in a joint agreement to up-skill existing Airport personnel enabling them to work across both locations when the need arises.

All airports across Australia have a legislative obligation to maintain operational standards as set by the Civil Aviation Safety Authority (CASA). These operational standards require daily inspection of airport runways, taxiway, lighting, weather reporting and navigation aids to ensure serviceability. Additional inspections are carried out ensuring airport security and management of wildlife.

The newly executed Memorandum of Understanding will ensure that CASA's provisions are safely and efficiently carried out in the event that regular Airport employees are absent.

District Council of Grant Chief Executive Office Darryl Whicker said "Borders are no barrier to collaboration. It's terrific to be working alongside the Glenelg Shire Council to ensure long-term resilience for both the Mount Gambier Regional Airport and Portland Airport. This collaboration will enable mutual learnings and establish longevity for our Airport operations."

Glenelg Shire Council Acting Chief Executive Officer David Hol said "The Memorandum of Understanding is a fantastic outcome in ensuring skilled labour is available for business continuity, and developing collaborative relationships to improve operational requirements." Mr Hol said.



Volunteering positions now open



Have you ever considered volunteering for the Country Fire Service (CFS)? Now is your chance to do so and make a positive impact within your community this Summer!

The CFS offers a range of roles which include:

- Firefighter
- Radio operations
- Catering
- Administration support
- Operational support
- Community education
- Fundraising

Young people between the ages of 11 and 18 can also get involved as a CFS cadet. Cadets are trained by qualified and experienced volunteers in firefighting skills, using fire hydrants, hoses and ladders, map reading and basic first aid.

Cost and time commitment

No out of pocket expenses should be incurred as a result of volunteering. All training, Personal Protective Equipment and Personal Protective Clothing will be provided by the CFS.

Apart from meeting minimum requirements for training and skills maintenance, the time a person can offer to a volunteering role can be negotiated with the local Brigade Captain.

Planning and Development Approval



How does the planning system work?

Did you know the South Australian Planning and Design Code (the Code) is South Australia's single source of planning policy for assessing Development Applications?

The Code also guides relevant authorities on how to progress matters such as Code Amendments which involves a number of steps which includes its initiation by the Minister for Planning.

In the November 2023 Community Newsletter, a brief guide will be presented providing more details on some of the above topics to allow our community to better understand planning processes.

Grant Funding - What is available?

RAA Regional Safety Grants

- A total of \$70,000 is available for community groups, schools and not-for-profit organisations carrying out safety projects in regional South Australia.
- Applicants can apply for funding between \$500 and \$10,000 for their safety project, program or activity. Successfully funded projects, programs or activities must be completed by 31 January 2025.
- Examples of safety project areas that would qualify for consideration include road, fire, children, community, school, water, personal and playground.

Conservation Grants

- The Limestone Coast Landscape Board is providing up to \$70,000 in funding to local landholders. The funding will support projects on properties that deliver biodiversity outcomes and primary production co-benefits.
- Projects must be able to commence 1 July 2024 and must not exceed 18 months in length. This means projects must be completed by 31 December 2025.
- Funding will be offered to individuals, volunteers, community organisations and other bodies based on a selection criteria which can be found via the Limestone Coast Landscape South Australia website below.

The District Council of Grant is pleased to re-launch the Community Grants Scheme and provides document detailing a summary of key information.

The Community Grants Scheme is for community groups to develop projects and events that enhance community wellbeing and increase participation in social and leisure activities.



Who can apply:

Incorporated not-for-profit organisations based in or servicing the District Council of Grant who do not collect substantial income from other sources.

Required documentation:

- 2023-2024 Application Form detailing a project or event which responds to a community need and contributes to building a stronger community;
- Evidence of Public Liability Insurance (or purchase appropriate capacity to coverage); and
- Copy of quotations supporting project or event costs and in-kind support (if applicable).
