PROJECT UPDATE

The wild winter weather has set the project back a few days, but this time will be made up over the coming weeks, with an estimated completion date of September 2018.

In July, more civil works were undertaken, in particular the timber, steel and concrete edging were installed, and the ground work for the jetty plaza has begun (above right).

Edging has gone in for the new raised planter boxes (above left). These are one of the key features of the jetty plaza precinct, and will provide character and depth to the space.

Street furniture is being built on site (below right). This particular item will be a large bench with a treated pine carcass, covered in recycled jetty timber - perfect for sitting and relaxing!

Council have been working behind the scenes with the Port MacDonnell Maritime Museum on tourism signage and imagery for the information shelter.

The bespoke bronze sculpture of the fisherman by Gillie and Marc, will be one of the last items to be installed in the plaza.



Did you know?
The feature boardwalk will use approximately 100m² of recycled jetty timber. The first jetty at Port MacDonnell was built in the 1860's and restored in 2015, with Council retaining the jetty timber for future open space projects.
